



BACK TO MONGOLIA

“I’m so happy that you are coming again, sister. Your visit is important to us. You’ve done great things to me during your last visit.” Oyunbolor Munkhtuvshin (campus worker from Mongolia).

This May, I (YK) will be returning to Mongolia with Roland and Jeremy, a colleague from EAST (Julienne can’t go this time as she’s preparing for graduation).

We will conduct a New Testament Survey course for 50 local workers and speak in several meetings. In fact the day after we arrive, I am scheduled to address 600 school teachers at an evangelistic meeting.

Pray for us. While the Lord is encouraging us to go by faith, He also reminds us this is a spiritual warfare. We need your prayers.

Another concern we have is this is not an easy time to raise support (our airfare alone costs S \$4000). But ‘now is the day of salvation’ (2 Cor 6:2), *now* is always the right time to serve the Lord.

Meanwhile, life is full at EAST, with teaching and mentoring of our students.

Next quarter, we will be teaching new courses - Biblical Interpretation for Roland and Media Communications for me - so we’re also occupied with lesson preparations.

In March, we spoke in several churches. I gave two talks on “the Holy Spirit” to university students in NUS, which is always a pleasure.

Julienne is into her final months of university. As we look back at how the Lord provided for her school fees during the past four years, we feel very blessed and grateful.

Not long ago, the papers reported that two students from NTU, our daughter’s school, committed suicide within the same week.

Such news always saddens us. And serves as a reminder that in our busyness, we mustn’t lose sight of what is really important: the souls of man and the plan of God to bring a lost world back to Himself.

Let us be faithful in proclaiming the gospel of hope, ‘in season and out of season’ (2 Tim 4:2).

Let us store up treasures in heaven, ‘where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal’ (Mat 6:20).
